Following a tip, he met a retired Singer repairman who introduced him to a gleaming Singer 201-2 that WK named "Lucy." He was also given two Singer 99s with the instruction to "find them good homes." Acquiring a reputation as the guy who would find loving homes for sewing machines, WK often found machines left

on his doorstep. When his home filled with vintage machines, he decided to open a hands-on museum –

a place where not only unusual and antique machines would be on display, but where young and old would be encouraged to sew (or learn to sew) using vintage machines. WK has purchased, collected, and received via donation well over 1,000 machines, including historically-significant machines, and unique children's machines in a room designed for younger visitors.



**Hours:** Tuesday-Saturday: 10am-6pm / Sunday-Monday: closed


**Admission:** \$10.00 per person (children under 15 are free)
